- Via Zoom: April 28, May 27



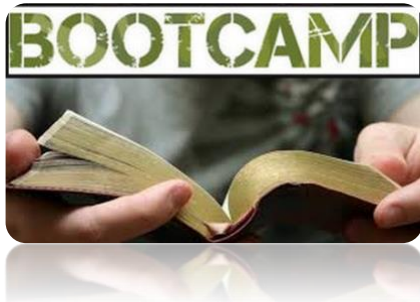
Bible Study

- Plan to arrive early to facilitate parking
- It would be a great blessing to arrive before service starts. Every aspect of the worship experience is bundled from beginning to end. Please be aware to not enter the sanctuary when the congregation is in standing prayer, which is a distraction to others. Likewise, it could be discourteous when trying to leave the sanctuary during standing prayers. Everyone is encouraged to experience the whole flow of the service, come prepared to worship, and keep entering and exiting to a minimum. Worshipers dealing with physical limitations are welcome to sit, stand, or exit the sanctuary as necessary. If we all adhere to these courtesies, the worship experience will be increased for all.
- Oneg (luncheon) following each service - Please keep in mind that the congregation supplies basics like plates, napkins, etc., and we need for all attending to bring the fare! If we do not bring it, we do not eat! It is not that everybody needs to bring something every week, but please be a regular contributor. Everyone is encouraged to come, eat, and schmooze even if you did not bring something one week... we should have you covered! The Oneg (delight) is where we build relationships!

Torah Service Clinic

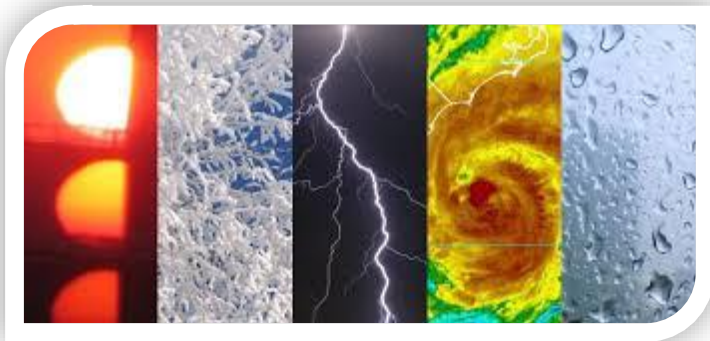
Learn the blessings over Torah readings and service protocol of lifting, dressing, and ark opening.

You may now access and download the newest messages from our web site onto your computer. This provides greater availability to you at less cost to the congregation.

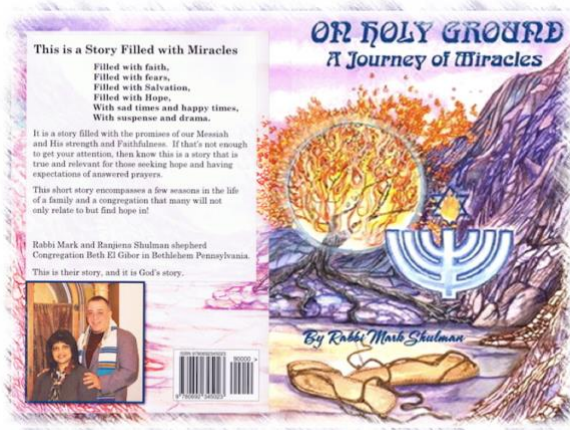
We are uploading past messages during the next few months. Several years of messages will be available to hear for the first time or to review over and over again.

Identifying the root of anti-Semitism, the hating of God's chosen people, and the relationship between it and Supersessionism (Replacement Theology) that has decimated the relationship between the Church and Israel. The objective is to bring to light the Church's role in being the leader in condemning Israel and the tools it has used to accomplish it.

Three primary methods are utilized to address the problem and propose how it can be addressed.

The Word of God, being Divine, is the only qualified source of God's plan, and His intent for bringing to fruition, and the source of man's ability to correct error.

History, not only that of the Bible, but the history of the Church from its inception and the historical record of Israel's persecution by the institution of the Church.


The third is related to the first, looking at the Eschatology of the Bible as Israel at the center, and highlighting the Syncretic Theological system known as Israelology, which in its simple definition, is a literal reading of the Biblical texts and confronting Replacement Theology that plagues Supersessionist Covenant Theology and looking at the weakness of Dispensationalist Theology regarding present day Israel.
